### Nancy's Notes

The summer stretches before us in ways we cannot imagine. We hope to be together again in our sacred space but frankly, we do not know when that will be. Our Bishop has asked us to be conservative as we contemplate reopening and our board is taking that seriously. We await further direction from him and from state and local authorities to guide our decisions. We know this much. It won't before June 14<sup>th</sup> and it may be much later. We are being guided by John Wesley's imperative to Do No Harm and have a Re-opening Task Force who is carefully considering all of our options.

As much as we long to be together the practice of worship does not lend itself to safety. We stay in the same space for a prolonged period of time and it is so very hard to social distance when all you want to do is hug one another, sing the songs of our faith and loudly proclaim our shared faith. And while all of that brings us joy it also puts us at risk for spreading the virus.

Here is what we do know. We are finding imaginative ways of being together. Drive by birthday celebrations, chatting on zoom, youth group and Try It gathering in virtual spaces all are helping us stay connected. We can worship together on Facebook live and the tv ministry where we see the beauty of the sanctuary, hear the majesty of the bells, and see beloved and familiar faces.

So, moving into our summer months we will keep on keeping on! Regardless of when we open the building to in-person worship we will continue to livestream and of course provide for our TV ministry. We plan to begin our 6-week summer worship series, Beguiled by Beauty, on June 14<sup>th</sup> and will finish by July 19<sup>th</sup>.

During these 6 weeks we will explore images of beauty found in the Old Testament Scriptures, primarily in the Psalms. In addition to delving into these scriptures during worship there will be opportunity for study groups – again, probably on line.

Ministry continues. Outreach continues. God is with us, sheltering us and loving us.
