

June 27 – When the Spirit Moves: Giving What You Have



# Reopening Committee letter

Greetings,

Since March of 2020, the leadership of First United Methodist Church has been prayerfully making decisions about keeping the church safe during this time of Covid-19. The Reopening Open Door Task Force met Thursday evening after the CDC loosened the mask mandates for people who have received their vaccines. For the past year we have kept John Wesley's Three Simple Rules at the forefront of our decision-making: **Do no harm. Do good. Stay in love with God**. They were at the forefront of our minds and hearts as we met on Thursday evening.

Both the CDC and the Office of the Bishop have recommended that each locale or congregation seriously consider their local context as they make decisions concerning masking in public.

Here is our context. As of Wednesday, May 13, LaPorte County is still in the orange and our positivity numbers are climbing. Many individuals in our congregation have not yet been fully vaccinated. Some are choosing not to be, our younger members are just now receiving their second dose of the vaccine, our teens are just now eligible, and our younger children are not yet age eligible, and others have health issues that preclude them from receiving the vaccine.

Several of our Soup Kitchen guests have not yet received or will not receive the vaccine. We have managed to feed thousands of meals a month to the most vulnerable in our city and, due to our vigilance, we have not had to close the soup kitchen one day because of Covid!

Because we are all in this together, at the beginning of the pandemic we made decisions to protect and care for our older members. Now we are making decisions to protect and care for our children, teens, and young adults, and to continue protecting and caring for our Soup Kitchen guests and volunteers.

You can probably get the sense of this letter by now. The Reopening Open Door Task Force made the decision to maintain the mask mandate at First United Methodist Church at least until our county reaches and maintains yellow status and at least those members of our church who are ages 12-15 can be fully vaccinated.

May we continue to care for one another in the best way we can.

As we welcome the weather - hopefully warmer June weather - we now have the opportunity to visit our friends and family. When visiting our Homebound friends I always think of topics I can ask. For example: If someone was married, I would ask "When were you married?" Then knowing that June was called the wedding month we probably would discuss that. Questions like: "How hot or cold was it the day you were married? Did anything out of the ordinary happen at your wedding?"

I remember a few years ago we had a program for the ladies of the community and it was a style show of formerly worn wedding dresses. Lois Chase's dress was worn by her granddaughter, Collette (Letty). Many beautiful dresses were worn and on display. It brought fashion into the present just showing styles of wedding dresses. I loved hearing Lois talk about her dress and what her wedding day was like. It put history in mind when some ladies wore military uniforms and not the elaborate wedding dresses we see now.

In asking questions we learn all wonderful things about people. If you are like me, I wish I would have asked my grandparents more questions, because now I have some questions and I have no way of learning the answers.

A few years ago I was taking a summer workshop and our assignment was to go to a retirement center to visit someone and to write their story. I had the pleasure of meeting a gentleman who was in the retirement center with his wife. He was worried about her and he told me his story. I call his story a love story. His name was Mr. Smith and he told me of the only time he ever left his wife. You see she loved spending time in Florida during the winter. (I know many of us can understand that feeling.) He said his relatives thought that he spoiled her by taking her to Florida every year, but he didn't feel that way. On one car trip they stopped at a gas station and she had been sleeping in the back seat so he proceeded to fill up the car and then he left. After a while he evidently looked in the back seat and she wasn't there. He still was beside himself telling me the story bringing tears to his eyes that he left her at the gas station. He drove back and sure enough his lovely wife was there waiting for his return.

After I wrote his short story I sent it to him and a few weeks later I read in the paper that Mrs. Smith died. I was sad knowing that she was not in his life any more but was happy that I had had the opportunity to visit with him and to see her briefly. My hope was that my short love story would help him in some way.

Do you think God cries when we are out of his sight? How thankful we are that we have his words in the Bible and can find answers to questions throughout our lives.
